Yellowstone Regional Airport Achieves an Error-Free FAA Certification Inspection

On June 9th and 10th, 2016, a Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Airport Certification Safety Inspector performed the Annual Inspection of the Yellowstone Regional Airport in Cody, Wyoming. The inspection revealed that the Airport is being operated in compliance with all Federal Aviation Regulations. Specifically, the FAA inspected the airfield to verify compliance with all safety and maintenance requirements, tested aircraft rescue fire-fighting capabilities and reviewed all training records and operating manuals. The FAA did not discover any violations or discrepancies and verified the Airport is in compliance with all FAA requirements.

The Inspector praised the Airport's efforts for meeting and in many cases, exceeding standards to enhance safety at the Airport. This error-free inspection is a significant achievement for the Airport staff who works hard each and every day to operate and maintain a safe professional facility. The Airport's safety record along with the FAA's confirmation, affirms the Airport's commitment to a well-maintained and safe aviation facility.
